If you accept this offer of admission, please be informed that the School of Graduate Studies and Postdoctoral Affairs must receive one official, hard copy, up to date original transcript of all your previous study, as well any degree certificates if applicable, from the university or universities you attended showing that any degree has been granted, before you will be permitted to be enrolled here. If the university or universities will send the official transcript/ degree certificate to us via email, that is an acceptable alternative to receiving a hard copy official transcript/degree certificate via regular mail. The email for the university or universities to use for this purpose is sgsapp@queensu.ca.

Once you have accepted this offer, your Queen's NetID and email will be available for you to activate within approximately 48 hours. To activate your Queen's NetID, visit <https://netid.queensu.ca/self-service/> and follow the instructions. If you receive an error, please wait the full 48 hours, allowing for your acceptance to be processed, before attempting activation again. You need your Queen's student number to go through these processes. Following the processing of your acceptance and the activation of your NetID, email can be accessed via the main Queen's home page by selecting Office 365 from the SEARCH AND SIGN IN button located at the top right. Please access your Queen's email account and check it often to read information sent to you from Queen's.

All fee information and fee payment arrangement information is available on the Office of the University Registrar's web site: <http://www.queensu.ca/registrar/financials/tuition-fees>. Fees for the upcoming academic session are normally posted in May.
